1996 Atlanta Summer Olympics





I utilized the Opening and Closing Ceremonies of the Alanta Summer Olympics for my dissertation and following book, *Nationalism on the World Stage*. The games were an excellent example of using the ceremonies as a strategic opportunity to revise local, national, and global understanding of a host's identity. Unlike the Los Angeles Opening Ceremonies, the Atlanta cultural and historical segments highlighted a regional identity as its own unique brand of American.

Southern culture was established from its earliest roots as a creation story through the Civil War and then reprised as a post-war construction. The display diminished Atlanta's heritage in slavery and reconstruction while highlighting the cultural aspects of its identity and the role Atlanta played in the Civil Rights movements.

Atlanta was my second onsite research project and a bulk of my work was made possible by the support of the Atlanta History Center and the then in formation Centennial Olympic Museum.
